

Anti-Nazi Is Fined \$25 Over Bund Rally Fight

Two Witnesses Give \$5 Each to Help Zadick Pay

Jack Zadick, one of the men arrested in the melee between German-American bund members and American war veterans at the Yorkville Casino last Wednesday night, was fined \$25 yesterday when he appeared on a disorderly conduct charge before Magistrate Myles A. Paige in Yorkville Court.

Remarking that he didn't have \$25 with him, Zadick, who lives at 334 East Eighty-sixth Street, was given the alternative of five days in jail, but two witnesses who had testified in his behalf each gave him \$5 and Zadick took the remaining \$15 from his pocket. His benefactors were Miss Grace Singer, of 239 Central Park West, a New York University student, and Walter Donaldson, book salesman, of 82 Horatio Street, both of whom said they had never seen Zadick until he exchanged punches outside the Casino with Van Gammeltoft, of 178 East Eighty-fifth Street, who was dressed on that occasion, in a Nazi storm trooper's uniform. Zadick had gone to the Casino as an anti-Nazi picket.
