

Former Rabbi Sues Kuhn for 3 Million

Dr. Jack Charges
Libel of Race

A \$3,000,000 slander suit was filed in Supreme Court today against Fritz Kuhn, leader of the German-American Bund, Nazi organization in the United States, by Dr. Emanuel J. Jack, of Yonkers, suing on behalf of himself and "all members of the Jewish faith who may join with me."

Dr. Jack, who is national chairman of the Army and Navy Veterans of the United States of America and a former rabbi of Temple Emanu-El, in Yonkers, charged that Mr. Kuhn had "conspired to cause members of the Jewish faith to be held up to public hatred, contempt, ridicule, aversion and disgrace."

He based his complaint on Mr. Kuhn's testimony before the McNaboe Legislative Committee investigating Nazi activities on June 21, citing the Nazi leader's assertion that "All Jews, without exception, are enemies of the United States."

The petition, filed by the law firm of Fogarty, Romey and Moynihan, of 217 Broadway, charged that "every member of the Jewish faith by reason of these utterances has been injured." The purpose of the bund, it was charged, is to "promote anti-Semitism and void the rights of all members of the Jewish faith as guaranteed by the Constitution."
