

BUND LEADER THREATENS CIO, LEGIONNAIRES

Ex-Convict Shouts for Blood of Congressman Dickstein

LOS ANGELES, June 30.—
"We will put a stop to the activities of that Jew Congressman Dickstein very soon."

While records of the Horst Wessel song scratched an accompaniment, 200 members of the Nazi German-American Bund gathered at their headquarters and heard Fascist Henry Allen shout threats at congressmen, police, the Los Angeles Examiner and John R. Lechner, chairman of the Americanism committee of the American Legion.

The warning directed at the New York congressman was made by Allen because of the former's listing of Los Angeles fascists which included the speaker.

The dingy Bund headquarters at 634 W. 15th Street here were strung with streamer banners, some of which read:

"Down with the CIO."

Others carried long quotations against Jews and against the police for daring to arrest Allen after he was caught in San Diego with dangerous weapons, and again when he registered falsely for the ballot.

"The Examiner has made a great deal about my arrest," shouted Allen. "The dirty yellow sheet's staff is made up of Jews. We got to get rid of all these Jew-Communists. Then there is Lechner, of the American Legion, who spoke at the Shrine Auditorium with the Jew Communist Anti-Nazi League."

"There will be an election soon in the region and Mr. Lechner will be O.K. We will run the Jews out. We will get them."

While delegates of Italian Fascist groups gathered around Allen, he shouted reprisals at District Attorney Byron Fitts for "ganging up" on him.

Allen was introduced by the head of the local Bund who declared that Allen has been "a patriot for the last four or five years."

Previously Allen had served time in prison for passing bad checks and most recently was arrested for falsely maintaining he had voting privileges.
