# Kuhn Declares They Resulted From Dickstein Plot

About 500 members of the Ger-About 500 members of the German-American Bund at the Turn Hall, 1,253 Lexington Avenue, last night heard their leader. Fritz Kuhn, and others denounce the conviction of six members of the organization at Riverhead, L. I., yesetrday as "a Jewish plot," conceived by Representative Samuel Dickstein, who has directed in vestigations of Nazis in this coupvestigations of Nazis in this country.

Mr. Kuhn said the case would be appealed to the Supreme Court, if necessary, and that "400,000 members of the organization" would be put on the stand to testify that the bund did not require an oath of allegiance to Adolf Hitler. He urged the audience to contribute to a fund for the appeal and a collection was taken.

Harder Stille, a guest speaker from Marietta, Ohio, criticized the audience when, in answer to a question if they wanted a government by Hitler in this country, there were shouts of "Yes."

"You should have said no," he said. "What we want is not a government by Hitler, but an American dictator from the mid-West to sweep the Communists and Jews in the street."
