a democracy rally August 28 at Lake

N. J., at which a program will be
outlined for the protection of New
Jersey school children from the influence of Nazi propaganda, alleged
to be disseminated from Camp Nordland, Andover, N. J.

Department of Education and of local school boards in ferreting out
indications of anti-Semitism among
high school and grammar school
children and of other un-American
principles as taught at the camp,
the league has pledged itself to take
all possible legal steps to effect the
closing of the camp.

German - Americans who oppose the Nazi regime in Germany, its purported efforts to undermine democracy here and its doctrine of racial superiority will gather at the rally. They are expected to come from all parts of the metropolitan area. The league claims a membership of 7,000 in New Jersey.
