25,000 Circulars, Dropped From Plane on Yaphank Picnic, Stress Tolerance

Headlined "This Is a Real American," the leaflets intended for members of the Bund, stressed tolerance, social equality, loyalty to the United States and "the obvious advantages of living in a country governed by the people and not by dictators."

There were 2,000 Nazis, men, women and children, picnicking on the grounds.

The anti-Nazi organization in a statement said the "bombing" had been undertaken only after determining that no violation of local ordinances was involved. "China gave us the idea three months ago," the statement said, "when they answered Japanese bombardments by dropping leaflets on the Japanese mainland. "Many of these people, we know, have no knowledge of the real issues at statke."

Yesterday's crowd was less than a third the size of the usual Sunday_turnout.
