## SUFFOLK TAKES OVER NAZI CAMP IN YAPHANK

Pending Sale to Raise Fine

YAPHANK, L. I., July 26.—Sheriff Jacob S. Dreyer of Suffolk County technically seized Camp Siegfried here today in a step to collect the \$10,000 fine imposed on the German-American Settlement League, Inc., operator of the camp, for violation of the State Civil Rights Law.

Sheriff Dreyer visited the camp and served notice on Henry Hauck, manager of the restaurant and bar and one of the six league leaders convicted in the recent trial, that the property would be sold after six weeks if the \$10,000 fine was not paid by that time. The Sheriff did not post the property for sale, but told Mr. Hauck that it would be advertised for sale once a week in the local papers, beginning Friday.

The Sheriff was acting in execution of a judgment entered yesterday against the league because of its failure to pay the fine imposed by County-Judge L. Barron Hill on July 12. Judge Hill had given the league ten days grace, but that period expired last Friday.

The buildings selzed in the Sheriff's levy include the three main structures and all the community houses of Geyman-American Bund units of the metropolitan frea Sheriff Dreyer said he would no levy on the business conducted by Mr. Hauck, since it was privately owned. The camp will be permit ted to operate as usual until the judgment is satisfied or the property sold, Mr. Dreyer said.

It is expected that Judge Hill will announce tomorrow his decision on the motion of defense attorneys for a new trial for the six league leaders.
