Bund Scared Out Of San Francisco

Scared out of San Francisco, Nazis all over California this week were preparing to hold their first convention in Los Angeles next Saturday, Sunday and Monday in the Deutsches Haus, local headquarters of the German-American Bund.

United action against "Jewish Communism" is the purpose of the Nazi gathering, as announced in the "Special Vigilante Number" of the Christian Free Press, Fascist paper, and in the call issued by Hermann Schwinn, West Coast director of the German-American Bund.

President Roosevelt will be one of the subjects of the un-American attack, since he is always spoken of by Nazis as "the Jew Rosenfeld."

Among the other ludicrous appeals in the call was one addressed to "American Indians," which said:

"American Indians must be defended against Jewish attempts to Bolshevise them and rob them of their land."

Selection of Los Angeles as the place for the convention is attributed to the Nazis' desire to get as far away from San Francisco as possible.

At the first conclave, held in the Bay City in May, more than a thousand anti-Nazis, including war veterans and church groups, kept up a continuous picket line and demonstration in front of the convention hall.

The Hollywood Anti-Nazi League is making appropriate plans.
