FORD RECEIVES HITLER REWARD

in building up the loud mouthed Austrian corporal into an international menace.

And when a mass Jewish boycott of Ford cars killed his Dearborn Independent the American billionaire fascist kept sending his money to Hitler.

At home Ford became the spearhead of Wall Street against labor. When unemployed Ford workers asked for bread at his factory gates in 1932 Harry Bennett and his gangsters shot them down—four dead others wounded—as the Czar shot down the petitioners at the Winter Palace in 1905.

Prince Edsel Ford supervised the job from a spot a few yards away.

Hitler took power the next year. The Berlin-Tokio pact came later, drawing in Ford with it too. And Henry Ford was shown up last year as a heavy buyer of Japanese bonds at the height of the Japanese invasion of peaceful China.

At home the murderous, fascist Black Legion arose—strongest in the areas Ford controlled. Union leaders organizing Ford workers were mysteriously murdered.

A fascist abroad Ford was seeking

a fascist state at home likewise. His friend Fritz Kuhn, the Nazi leader, left a job in Ford's chemical division and began organizing Nazi groups in many cities with the help of abundant secret funds.

Ford's Nazi sympathies became notorious. So much so that Ambassador Dodd at Berlin two years ago informed the world that an American billionaire was seek-

ing to establish a dictatorship in the United States.

Newspaper correspondents said he meant Ford, the man Hitler paid off with a medal.
