W. Diversey Blvd. Gilbert Rocke, secretary of the Chicago American League for Peace and Dem-ocracy, declared that while the demonstration was in progress that the maximum progress that the maximum number of persons in the hall was 120. The league had three observers in the hall during that time, said Rocke. Rocke asserted that the Na-

zis shrunk from going through the closed ranks of the 7,000 demonstrators, who booed, hiss-ed, catcalled, and shouted "Down with Hitler," at dhem, even though they were afforded po-lice protection. Dr. Eric von Schroetter, sec-retary of the German-American League for Culture, praised the discipline of the demonstrators. Won Schroetter Reclared: "The Nazi spy trial in New York Should convince the people of Chicage of zis shrunk from going through

the people of Chicago of the real anti-American ha-ture of the Nazi German-American Bund. Then Chi-cago would join the long list of cities which will not permit these enemies of democracy to hold meet-

ings." All 13 arrested demonstrators were freed. The only one held overnight was the sole woman arnested, Mrs. Rose Sebek, 45, who was dismissed in Judge Os-car Cappan's court yesterday
