Pickets Hold Nazis in Hall In Newark Demonstration Kuhn by United Jersey Groups

NEWARK, Oct. 27.—An aroused population, determined to drive the Nazis out of this city, surrounded a meeting of the Hitler Bund last night and carried through one of the finest demonstrations seen here

Learning of the Bund meeting to be held at Schwaben Halle anti-Nazi organizations set up a united front to picket the affair. Until 1:40 in the morning, while 200 police guarded the assembled fascists in the hall, the picketing continued.

The Nazis hid behind the police clubs and dared not go home. At one point the police attempted to escort the imprisoned Hitlerites to waiting automobiles but as soon as they reached the streets pickets followed. The procession of Nazis and their protectors wound through

and their protectors wound through the city for about a mile. The police gave up and marched their charges back to the hall.

For two and a half hours after their meeting had ended these Nazis waited in the hall as the members of the American League for Peace and Democracy, the Jewish War Veterans, the German Workers' Sick and Death Benefit Assn., the American Youth Congress, Labor's Non-Partisan League, the Minute Men of Newark and International Workers Order marched ternational Workers Order marched outside.

Having failed at a mass rescue of the fascists police turned to the strategy of sending them out one at a time, each guarded by two police.

Five of the anti-fascists were ar-

rested.

The Nazis said that the meeting had been called to plan a meeting for their flational leader. Fritz Kuhn. Kuhn was recently driven out of New Jersey when he tried to make a speech on German Day.
