Hit Nazi Progroms

Youngstown ^{11/28/38}
Holds Protest
Rally Tonight

YOUNGSTOWN, O., Nov. 27.—Roger Chase, prominent member of the American Civil Liberties Union of Cleveland, will be the main speaker at the protest meeting against Nazi persecution of Catholics and Jews to be held Monday evening at 8 p. m. in the Central Auditorium, 225 W. Boardman Street.

Rev. Robert Clemmons, Pastor of the Mineral Ridge Methodist Church, and chairman of the Youngstown Peace Forum, which is sponsoring the meeting, announced Chase's acceptance of the invitation to speak today.

Local speakers who will take the stand to express their opinion of the Nazi outrages of the past few weeks will include: Dr. J. E. Philo of Rodef Sholem Temple; Father Wm. Nash of St. Edward's Church; John L. Mayo, Sub-Regional Director of the S. W. O. C.; Atty. Wm. H. Howard of the N. A. A. C. P.; D. D. Farkes of the Jewish War Veterans; Charles Hogg, Secretary of the United Labor Congress of Mahoning County; Rev. W. B. Gordon, assistant pastor of the Third Baptist Church; and Rabbi Leon Stitskin of Warren.

In addition to the above-named speakers, the meeting has as sponsors the following people: Rev. Roland Luhman of the First Reformed Church; Councilman I. Vagnozzi, Miss Pearl Bourne, Secretary of the Business and Industrial Girls' Department of the Y. W. C. A.; Rev. W. O. Harper of the Third Baptist Church; Senator Maurice Lipscher; Rev. Schuyler Garth of Trinity M. E. Church; Joseph Stephany of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers; Rev. F. C. McBride of Grace M. E. Church; Joseph Stephany professor of Violin at Youngstown College; Rabbi Carl Manalo, and H. G. Emerson of the Negro B. P. O. E.

Rev. Clemmons, who will be chairman of the meeting, today urged all democratic-peace-loving people of Youngstown and vicinity to attend the meeting and add their voice to the wave of protest against Nazi persecution of minorities that is sweeping the United States.
