## 800 FLAY NAZIS IN YOUNGSTOWN

YOUNGSTOWN, O., Nov. 31  
—Leading clergymen spoke to a mass meeting here last Monday which urged an embargo on Nazi Germany "to alleviate the sufferings of the victims of Nazi persecution."

More than 800 persons heard leading churchmen and laymen in a stirring appeal for unity of Americans against the Hitler outrages.

The meeting was the first in a series of meetings sponsored by the Youngstown Peace Forum. Among the speakers were:

Rev. Robert Clemmons of the Mineral Ridge Episcopal Church; Rev. William S. Nash, pastor of St. Edwards Catholic Church; Rabbi Leon Stitskin of Warren; John L. Mayo, sub-regional director of the Steel Workers Organizing Committee, and Russell Chose, president of the Lawyers Guild of Cleveland.
