Harlem Cheers as Women Parade in Big Anti-Nazi Rally

Several hundred women and children paraded through the heart of Harlem yesterday afternoon and participated in a demonstration mass rally protesting Fascist aggression and Nazi brutality.

The demonstration, which was postponed from two weeks ago because of inclement weather, brought hundreds of women into the street pushing baby carriages, carrying little tots in their arms and holding placards denouncing Nazi politics.

The parade got under way at 110th St. and Fifth Ave. and circled through Harlem, past cheering thousands who lined the sidewalks, coming to a stop at 125th St. and Seventh Ave., where many prominent speakers addressed the assembled throng.

Mrs. Alta Douglas, wife of the leading Negro painter Aaron Douglas, keyed the meeting with a

call to stop all trade with Germany, and a plea for a boycott of all Nazi and Fascist goods.

Other speakers were Miss Elizabeth Newby, vice-president of Teachers Union Local 453; Mrs. A. W. Berry, head of the Progressive Harlem Women's Nursery Club; Mrs. Charles H. Griffin, wife of Dr. Charles H. Griffin, prominent Harlem dentist, and Miss Helen Harris, head of the Harlem Union House.

Among the sponsors of the meeting were Mrs. Vito Marcantonio, wife of the Congressman-elect from lower Harlem, Mrs. Celia Saunders, Harlem YMCA secretary, and Mrs. Regina Andrews, head of the Harlem Public Library.
