Akron CIO Hits Nazis

Urges Cooperation
Of Democracies
Against Fascism

AKRON, O., Dec. 11.—The Akron Industrial Union Council, consisting of all local CIO affiliates, called for the lifting of the embargo on Loyalist Spain and for placing a ban on trade with fascist nations at its last meeting.

Pres. Roosevelt and Secretary of State Cordell Hull were notified of the action of the council.

Charging Germany, Italy and Japan with being warmakers threatening the peace of the world, the council urged cooperation of democratic nations in a trade ban against the aggressors.

The council sent word to Leon Jouhaux, French labor leader, expressing sympathy and condemning the Daladier cabinet for its cooperation at Munich with Hitler.

This action, said the council, "now resolves itself into an attack upon the people and gains of the French labor movement."
