## Nazi Jailed for Mailing Threatening Postcards

### Official of Aryan Supremacy League Gets 15 Months

NEW ORLEANS, Dec. 15 (AP).—Joseph Hahn-Korff, a German subject, who described himself as secretary of the New Orleans League for the Restoration of Aryan Supremacy in America, was convicted by a Federal Court jury today on a charge of sending "scurrilous" matter through the mails.

Hahn-Korff was convicted on the first two of six counts of a Federal indictment returned in connection with alleged threats sent on postcards to Tulane University faculty

members and others. The Jewish racial question was raised in the messages.

G. Wray Gill, court-appointed defense counsel, asked for mercy on the ground that Hahn-Korff was a foreigner and "possibly not acquainted with the standards in America."

Judge Wayne G. Borah sentenced Hahn-Korff to serve fifteen months in jail on each count, the sentences to run concurrently. Mr. Gill said no appeal would be taken.

"As an explanation and not an excuse for my acts," Hahn-Korff told the judge, "I want the court to know that I did not know those cards I sent were unlawful. For us Nazis the law is sacred, and I am ready to take my punishment."
