is robbing and torturing thou-sands of fellow human beings."

He took a passing shot, in his criticism of racial, religious and economic intolerance, at a "chairman of a congressional investigat-ing committee," whom observers un-derstood to be Rep. Martin Dies, chairman of the house un-American committee.

"I am as opposed to the intoler-ance that is fomented as a justification for robbing and suppress-ing Jews abroad," he said, "as I "as I am to the cunning and spiteful intolerance of the chairman of a congressional investigating committee who by some mischance finds himself clothed with a little brief authority in the wanton exercise of which he violates every rule of deconcy and fair play."

Ickes said Americans must demand just and equal treatment for Jews, and added that he personally wished America's gates might be thrown open "to the political ref-ugees of any country."

Ickes made no definite proposal for modifying the immigration laws to solve the refugee problem, but explained that he believed the im-migration laws should be observed until a method was found of modi-fying them.

In a sarcastic attack on the fascist'states, Ickes remarked that "certain sections of Europe today have made it possible for ethnologists and anthropologists to study primitive man without having to sift kitchen middens or attempt to reconstruct a primitive scale or the basis a primitive social order on the basis of a human jawbone."

"The inquisitions of Spain might do a job of diabolical crueity on the bodies of Jews who came within their power, but they lacked the thoroughness, the ingenuity and the super-cruelty of their prototypes in modern totalitarian countries," Ickes said.
