

U S. Acts on Bund Aid

Asks Naturalization Papers of West Coast Leader Be Canceled

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 19 (AP).—United States Attorney Benjamin Harrison asked cancellation of the naturalization certificate of Herman Max Schwinn, west coast director of the German-American Bund, in a complaint filed in Federal court today.

Harrison charged that although Gerhard Foestel and George E. Martens submitted affidavits, in connection with Schwinn's citizenship application, that they had known him since 1927 and he was of good moral character, that they did not meet him until the next year.
