Ban on All Nazis Here Proposed Former Reichstrag Member Worns

U.S. to Beware (Special to the Record)

WASHINGTON, Dec. 20-Outlawing of all Mazi activities in the United States was urged here last night by Gerhart Seger, former member of the German Reichstag.

Speaking at the Washington Town Hall Forum, Seger, who is now editor of the Neue Volkzeitung in New York, urged immediate dissolution of all Nazi camps in this country and suppression of all semi-military organizations in the U. S.

"The United States should by all means avoid repeating the mistakes made by the young German republic before Hitlor came to power," he said.

Other governmental steps urged by Seger are:

1. A close check on the activities of diplomatic reppresentatives of fascist governments.

2. Probing of the "German-American Business in ess League," which Seger accused of using money obtained from German-American business men to finance Nazi propaganda in this country.

country. 3. Halting of all exchange of professors and students with the Nazis.

4. Passage of an act providing for government clearance of all inheritance cases between the United States and Germany.
