

## White Shirt Chieftain Faces Sedition Trial

CHATTANOOGA, April 29.—A Federal grand jury today returned two indictments against George W. Christians, Chattanooga engineer, ~~former~~ unorthodox economist, charging distribution of subversive literature.

Arraigned before United States District Judge Leslie R. Darr, Mr. Christians pleaded not guilty and his trial was set for May 13.

The two bills returned against Mr. Christians, who calls himself the commander of the "Crusader White Shirts," charged sedition in the printing, publishing and distribution of literature to members of the armed forces inciting them to "insubordination, disloyalty, mutiny and refusal of duty."

The indictments charged specifically that Mr. Christians sent the allegedly seditious literature by mail to the commanding officers and to enlisted personnel at Camp Forrest, Tenn., and Fort Oglethorpe, Ga.

Mr. Christians has advocated an economic order based on use of labor as the monetary standard.
