

Christians' Outbursts Mark Sedition Trial

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn., June 3.—George W. Christians, 53-year-old engineer-economist, shouted "there is plenty of revolutionary red" in the United States flag during cross-examination today in his trial on charges of sedition.

The outburst was one of many marking his cross-examination in Federal Court by United States District Attorney J. B. Frazier, jr., on the aims of the "Crusader White Shirts" which Christians headed.

Mr. Frazier had shown Christians a red silk flag bordered in gold with a flaming torch in its center and asked if it was the "red flag" of the Crusaders of Economic Liberty.

"It is not the crusader flag, unless the American flag accompanies it," Christians heatedly replied, then asked that a United States flag on the prosecutor's desk be displayed to show the "revolutionary red" in it.

In answer to Mr. Frazier's questions, the defendant repeatedly referred to such phrases as "a reign of terror," when the "mad mob gets in motion," and "flames of anarchy" as "warnings" he had sent to responsible officials in the hope of averting such events and not "threats" as the prosecutor termed them.
