To Discredit Britain

A piece of Nazi propaganda, released yesterday by the one-man Columbia Press Service of Washington, D. C., had the questionable benefit of an introduction by George Sylvester Viereck, paid German agent in this country. The "amazing document" was said to expose Britain "as an undemocratic gigantic holding corporation, closely held by a tiny caste of rich families." Actually, the "shocker" which the press service reported "sizzled and exploded in the capital" was a book, The Hundred Families That Rule the Empire, published by the pro-Nazi Flanders Hall outfit of Scotch Plains, N. J.
