Dennis to Make No Further

Effort to Enter Army

TEANECK, N. J., April 20— Having been denied a captaincy in the military police branch of the the military police branch of the Army by the War Department, Lawrence Dennis, an advocate of fascism in the United States and author of "The Coming American Fiscism," said today he would make no further effort to get into the armed forces.

"I felt that I saw my duty and I did it," the 48-year-old veteran of World War I, who is now editor of The Weekly Foreign Letter, said. He declared he had applied for a commission Jan. 14, received his physical examination in February and got notice of his rejection in a printed form that gave no specific reasons.
