F. B. I. Considers Transfer Of Its School to Quantico

J. Edgar Hoover, chief of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, is considering transfer of the training school for F. B. I. agents to Quantico, Va., to relieve pressure for space at the headquarters here.

In testimony before the House Appropriations Subcommittee, made public today, Mr. Hoover said a proposed expansion in personnel of the F. B. I. would afford "quite a problem" so far as physical accommodations were concerned. The F. B. I. is housed in the Justice Department Building.

"In the department at the present time," he said, "we are crowded and this additional personnel will crowd us even more. As a matter of fact, I have even considered the use of the barracks at Quantico for housing our new agents' school for six-week periods of instruction so the classrooms at Washington can be used for office purposes."
