# Hill Sentenced; <br> Rep. Fish Again <br> To Face Jurors <br> Secretary Gets Jail <br> Term of 2-6 Years <br> In Propaganda Case 

Representative Hamiliton Fish (R.); of New York, again on Tues day will be called before the spe cial Grand Jury investigating for eign propagandists, it was learned last night after his secretary George Hill, had been sentenced from two to six years in prison earlier in the day for perjury.
The legislator, who was before the special jury several weeks ago on his return from military serv ice, will be asked to testify along with Prescott Dennett. Witness who has been called many times, announced by William P. Maloney special assistant to the Attorney General.
"Surprise Witness"
Although the name of the "sur prise witness" was not made pubic, there was speculation as to who rer might be Hill himself. ho remained in bistrict for a reversal of his conviction by his attorneys, John J. O'Connor and Willam F. Cusick.
Before sentence was in on Hill by Justice F. Dickinson Ietts in court yesterday it was indicated that efforts to have Hill tell all" and thus possibly be pually probation instead of ac through.
When asked by his counsel if he had anything to tell the court Hill replied, "I understand you fellows offered a proposition to them"-indicating the Govern ment attorneys-"and that you further, however when aot he wished to retract anything said to the Grand Jury.
Unmoved at Sentence
The tall, thin, ex-World War veteran, who has the Order of the Purple Heart, then heard his entence pronounced without a vis le sign of emotion. Justice Lett said he was not imposing the maxieach of two counts, to year on the "views of a number of people ncluding Members of Congress. in regard to the defendant.
