

Bund Rally Condemned As 'Horrible Exhibition'

Jersey Sons of Revolution Told U. S. Must Fight Alien Ideas

TRENTON, N. J., Feb. 22.—The New York demonstration by the German American Bund was a "horrible exhibition," Frank D. Potter, president of the Sons of the Revolution of New Jersey, said today at the organization's observance of Washington's birthday.

Remarking that the whole nation was conscious of the foreign influences at work in this country, Mr. Potter said the time had arrived for vigorous action to prevent their spread and safeguard traditional American ideals and principles.
