South Bend Nazis Rap FDR, Jews

Anti-Fascists Expose Nature of Secret Bund Meeting

SOUTH BEND, Jan. 26—Enraged by treasonous remarks made by several pro-Hitler speakers who were addressing a secret meeting of the local German-American Bund, a group of anti-fascists who had got wind of the meeting halted it when they insisted exposing its fascist nature.

Only after making clear their unalterable opposition to Hitler, the Bund and other treasonable groups, did the anti-fascists permit the meeting to continue. From then on, the speakers, representing a pro-Nazi organization called "The All-American Plan," were careful to stick to their ostensible program—financial reform of the currency.

The infamous forgeries, the long-discredited "Protocols of Zion," were freely distributed, however.

FRONT FOR BUND

Hurley H. Smith and "Professor Edwards," the

speakers who addressed the small gathering, admitted that their organization was one of the numerous "American" fronts for the German Bund when they admitted that the Bund had endorsed their program and that they were working in cooperation with it.

Hitler was lavishly praised by Edwards, who declared, "I would like to shake hands with Hitler; if America doesn't change its set-up soon, some other nation will do it and become the greatest power on earth."

Edwards also attacked the President Roosevelt's defense program. "Japan and Germany are only cleaning house," he shrieked, "they only want to be let alone. If the Huns invade and attack us, we have it coming to us! What is happening in Spain is on the way over here now!"

ATTACKS WAGNER ACT

Edwards stated that Roosevelt "is in league with the international scoundrels," and he attacked the Wagner Act and the Works Relief program.

Smith described John L. Lewis as "one of the wealthy individuals who controlled the country."
