Police Guard Removed From Kuhn's Home

The police guard at the home of Fritz Kuhn, leader of the German-American Bund, at 33-42 Seventy-third street, Jackson Heights, Queens, was removed at 8 A. M. today when police of the Newtown precinct ended their late tour.

The guard was established day and night by Inspector Charles Mooney, in charge of the North Queens police division, when Kuhn received a number of threatening and abusive letters after his home address had been revealed when he appeared in a Brooklyn court. Inspector Mooney said that there was no indication today that the guard was needed any longer.

Reporters who tried to confirm a report that Kuhn was planning to leave his home. However, several of Kuhn's neighbors said that they understood that he was moving to Kew Gardens, Queens, soon.
