MAYOR DECLINES TO HALT MEETING OF BUND MONDAY

Ours a Land of Free Speech, He Says, Not a **Hitler Country**

Despite a number of protests, Mayor LaGuardia will take no steps to prevent the meeting of the Ger-man-American Bund at Madison Square Garden Monday night. "It would be a strange thing in-deed," the Mayor told reporters last night, "if because I don't agree with the sponsors of this meeting and be-cause they abused the Mayor of New York, I should make any attempt to prevent their meeting. "I would then be doing exactly as Hitler is doing, in carrying on his abhorrent form of government." Heavy Police Detail

The meeting will be heavily po-liced, Mayor LaGuardia said, but there will be no interference "as long as it is conducted in an orderly and peaceful fashion with no vio-lence advocated and no preaching of the overthrow of our govern-ment."

The Mayor said most of the pro-tests which he has received "are ab-solutely sincere and are based upon disagreement with the views of the Bund," but he added: "Our government provides for free speech, and in this city that right will be respected. It would be a strange kind of free speech which permits free speech for those we agree with. That's the kind of free speech they have in Fascist countries."

"Washington Birthday" Fete

"Washington Birthday" Fete Regarding a Bund statement that 3,000 of its own members would police the meeting, he said: "The police will attend to their duties, and no one will supplant them." Commissioner Valentine, in a separate interview, echoed this statement, saying 1,000 cops would be on hand. The Bund calls the meeting "George Washington birthday ex-ercises . . . a mass demonstration for true Americanism." Between 30,000 and 40,000 pro-Nazis are ex-pected to attend. A call for anti-Nazis to mobilize outside Madison Square Garden Monday night was sent out by the Socialist Workers' Party, a Trotsky-ite group. "The the Fascists feel the anger
