Second Count Case Heard The German American Bund and its leader, Fritz Kuhn were in dif-ficulties yesterday on three legal fronts, of which the most important was in the office of Oity Treasurer Almeriudo Bortfolio foulties yesterday on three legal fronts, of which the most important was in the office of City Treasurer Almerindo Portfolio. There Mr. Portfolio and William B. Herlands, Commissioner of Invertigation, ques-ioned Kuhn and six other persons connected with the bund and affili-ited, organizations behind closed loors to see whether they have been paying all requisite sales and busi-ness taxes on sales of uniforms, propaganda emblems or other goods. The two city officials had suc-beded in having subpoenas served on Kuhn and other Nazi organizers ate Thursday afternoon at bund peadquarters, 178 Flast Eighty-fifth street. It was learned that although ity officials described the tax in-uiry as routine, the subpoena called or all membership lists, subscrip-ion lists, bank accounts, bank state-nents and canceled checks, which night throw general light on the imancial life of the bund and its fillates. However, the only documents rought to Mr. Portfolio's office were ontained in one brief case and a mall brown-paper package. Commissioner Herlands said that 1 except Kuhn would return at 1:30 a. m. Monday for further ques-oning, while Kuhn will return next ednesday at 10 a. m. Kuhn in Brooklyn Court Earlier Kuhn appeared with Mr. Salenderian in Bay Ridge Magis-trate's Court, Brooklyn, in response to a subpoena served on him after a three-day search, to answer a com-plaint of criminal libel made by former Magistrite Joseph Goldstein. Mr. Goldstein became very excited and demanded that bail be set for the Nazi leader. However, Magis-trate Jeanette G. Brill, who had to quiet him down, followed the rec-ommendation of Henry Martuscello, Assistant District Attorney of Kings County, and paroled Kuhn in the custody of his counsel for a hearing in the same court on March 10. Mr. Goldstein did succeed in forcing Kuhn to state that his home address was at 33-42 Seventy-third Street, Jackson Heights, Queens, which the bund fuenrer had con-cealed. He called Kuhn and his fol-lowers "yellow," and when Kuhn told him that that was a lie, he de-clared that the Nazi should be jalled for "contempt of court."
