BUND LEADER FINED AGAIN

Kuhn Assessed \$10 for Speeding,
Hears License Is in Jeopardy

Fritz Kuhn, head of the German-American Bund, was fined \$10 yesterday in Washington Heights Traffic Court by Magistrate Bernard Mogilesky as a second offender on a speeding charge and warned that his license would be revoked if he is convicted again within the next eighteen months.

Kuhn did not appear in court but was represented by a friend who gave him name as William Ludke of 120 Sanson Street, Garfield, N. J., and said he was connected with the German-American Business League. Ludke paid the fine after pleading guilty for Kuhn to the charge of driving forty-eight miles an hour on the East River Drive, March 21. On March 10, Magistrate Mogilesky fined the bund leader \$5 in Bronx Traffic Court for driving at the rate of sixty-five miles an hour on the Henry Hudson Parkway in the Bronx.

When Patrolman Emmett J. Shields of Motorcycle Squad I issued the second summons, Kuhn gave his occupation as "business agent" and his address as 178 East Eighty-fifth Street.
