Subpoena 6 More Bund Leaders Here

Herlands Presses Drive Against Hitler Gang; To Appear Tomorrow

Commissioner of Investigation William B. Herlands and City Treasurer A. Merindo Portfollo, pressing an inquiry into the financial affairs of the Nazi German-American Bund, issued subpoenas yesterday for six local leaders of the gang, the owners of two uniform factories and the proprietors of two propaganda-printing shops.

All were directed to appear at 10 A. M. tomorrow and to produce membership and subscription lists, as well as all books, accounts and records pertaining to receipts for the sale of pamphlets, newspapers, books and uniforms. Bund bank statements and cancelled checks were also ordered brought in.

The Hitlerites subpoenaed were James Wheeler-Hill, Karl Nicolai, Henry Van Holt, Herman Schwarzman, Gustav Vogt, and Walter Brohers, Bund unit leaders in Manhattan, Brooklyn, The Bronx, Astoria, Staten Island, and Jamaica, respectively.

SUBPOENA TAILORS

The tailors, who are said to have manufactured uniforms, caps and belts for the Nazi storm troopers, are E. O. Krause of 308 E. 86th St., and Max Buchte of 901 Wyckoff Ave., Brooklyn.

The John Willig Press, Inc., of 72-74 Gordon St., Stapleton, S. I., and the Hackl Press, 1554 Third Ave., were the two publishing houses ordered to appear.

It is charged that the Bund has not paid sales taxes on uniforms and literature sold by it. Heavy jail sentences face officials of the outfit if the charges are substantiated.
