Nazi Propaganda Pouring Into U. S. Connects Bund With Hitler Government

A Blue Candle, A Picture Magazine, And A Calendar-

Not just harmless trifles, but tangible evidence of the German-American Bund's direct connection with Adolf Hitler's Nazi government.

The evidence came directly from Germany to a member of the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League.

This is how it happened:

The member once attended a meeting of the German-American Bund in the Deutsches Haus, 634 West Fifteenth street, where there was a register for all those to sign who wanted to receive the Bund's notices.

The member signed an assumed name, but his own address. received the Bund notices regularly.

Around Christmas, 1938, he received something else-a box with a crude wooden candle holder, a blue candle, and a printed circular. The box was mailed from Berlin, and it was addressed to the name that the member had written on the Bund's register.

A week later the member received something else from Berlin. This time it was a rotogravure magazine, "Volksdeutsche."

Another week passed and still another package arrived, a calendar with dozens of beautiful pictures and page after page of German text.

A 'Gift' From the Nazis

What person or organizations was this that was sending gifts to people whose names were gathered by the German-American Bund?

It was none other than the Nazi government itself, working through the "Volksbund Fur Das Deutschtum im Ausland," the League for Germanism Abroad.

The head of this League is one of the most important offi-cians of the German government, Ernst Wilhelm Bohle. Before 1937, Bohle worked only for the Nazi party as chief of the foreign organization whose duty it was to organize Germans in every country of the world into a strong racial bloc that would carry out Nazi orders.

In February, 1937, this department of the Nail party was made official section of the German Foreign Office with Bohle as head.

Thus the building up of a Nazi party in other countries be-came a function of the German government. Automatically the organizations which Bohle controlled, such as the League for Germanism Abroad, became a part of the gov-ernment.

The Bund Supplies the Names

And although the Nazi government has denied any connection with the German-American Bund, the Bund is the source through which the government obtains names to send its propaganda.

But the contents of the circular, the magazine and the collendar are the best proof that they were sent out by the Nazi government. The circular explains that the blue candle is a symbol of the loyalty of Germans all over the world to their homeland. It devotes

three pages to a letter to a "Dear Friend in America" justifying the persecution of Jews after the Von Rath murder. "The press of your country, which represents us as barbaric tor-turers, is lying," it said.

Largest picture in the rotogravure magazine is one of the Nazi party congress and another of Konrad Henlein giving the banner of the Sudetenland to Rudolf Hess "in the name of the Fuehrer." An article, "Memel Land Asks for Its Rights," gives a long list of political and economic abuses supposedly suffered by the German popu-lation at the hands of the Lithuanian government. Another article laments that in Eastern Canada most of the Ger-mans have been Anglicized. The United States is symbolized by a picture of a broken down tractor mired in the mud. Three pictures of German kindergartens and summer camps in the United States are impressive if not truth-ful. In one of them a large sign "LIFE" shows the camp to be the one run every summer by Life Magazine.

Calendar Glorifies Hitler

Illustrated with many fine photographs of German landscape and German life, the calendar's chief purpose is expressed in its foreword: "May you find refuge from foreign lands in these pages, as you find it in the face of a dear friend far from your native country. In the Reich our thoughts remind us daily that 25,000,000 raclal comrades beyond our borders carry German ideals and German heritage, and we announce to these countrymen out there that we in the Reich are standing with them and we are ready to make sacrifices true to our leader who says. He who loves his fellow-German can show it only through the sacrifices he is willing to make for him."

'Hitler and other Nazi leaders are glorified on every page through a list of historical events.

Here is a typical one, labeled "Five Days of German History," which shows the vastly modified version of affairs which Nazi propa-gandists give to the German people:

andists give to the German people: "Friday, March 11, 1938—In Austria there is a great deal of ex-eltement because the Chancellor has announced a plebiscite, and it is feared that the voting will be very disorderly. "6:15 p. m.—The plebiscite for March 11 must be delayed. "7:45 p. m.—The plebiscite for March 11 must be delayed.  THE French government bowed today to British pressure by agreeing to keep the Spanish frontier closed to aid or the hard-pressed defenders of Barcelona but determined on a 'vigilant defense' of French interests." So runs the story that came out of Paris Wednesday. A few days earlier the newspapers reported that Neville Chamberlain had come away from his conference with Mus-solini without offering any appeasement to satisfy the Fas-cist dictator's demands on France. Only those who believe that the sole method of appease-ment lay in giving Mussolini French territories or granting belligerent rights to Franco could come to such a false con-clusion. clusion.

THE Loyalist government needs arms, arms that it can buy in France. Franco's success, and through him, Mussolini and Hitler's success, depend on the Loyalists' not receiving

and Hitler's success, depend on the Loyalists' not receiving those arms. It is clear that Chamberlain serves Mussolini and not France by threatening to desert France if it aids the Span-ish Loyalists. If Mussolini and Hitler should win in Spain, an attack by them on France from their base in Spain is an absolute certainty. Such an attack would mean war, a war which very soon would involve all of Europe. But France is not the only country whose immediate fate

But France is not the only country whose immediate fate depends on a Loyalist victory.

SPAIN is the fatherland of all the Latin-American countries, and the favorite Nazi technique is to foment returns the fatherland, as it did among the Austrians and the to the


to the fatherland, as it did among the Austrians and the Sudeten Germans. The same technique, the same propaganda would be used to draw the Spanish-American peoples under the control of a Fascist Spain. Then our own country would be under the threat of attack, just as France is today. The United States' fate, its future as a democracy, its freedom from war, depend on a Loyalist victory in Spain. It can supply the arms that France is afraid to, if Con-gress will change the Neutrality Act so that the embargo can be lifted. By so doing, it will help to prevent a great war, a war

Problems facing the Negro people will get a full airing at a state conference of Negro organiza-tions and their friends called by the National Negro Congress for February 10-12 at 1158 East Twatfith Streat February 10-1 Twelfth Street.

February 10-12 at 1158 East Twelfth Street. Among the issues to be discussed are the passage of an anti-lynching bill, adequate appropriation for re-ilef and works projects, inclusion of Negroes in health legislation, a maximum hour law in the state for domestic workers, aboli-tion of discrimination in civil ser-vice and in public utilities employ-ment, organization of Negroes into trade unions, and appointment of qualified Negroes to positions in state, city, and county agencies. The call urged all organizations sympathetic to the aims of the con-ference to send delegates. "The Negro people need the support of all their friends; as a minority they cannot win their battle alone," it declared.


