# U. S. Report to Bare Nazi Radio Propaganda Data on Drive in South America to Be Given President Roosevelt

WASHINGTON, April 10 (UP).—

A committee of high government officials is preparing a report for President Roosevelt stating that German radio stations are broadcasting news to South America "colored" to favor totalitarian ideas, it was learned today.

The report may recommend a government station to broadcast to Latin American peoples. Several private stations already are carrying special broadcasts for South America.

The committee, headed by Chairman Frank R. McNinch of the Federal Communications Commission, has been investigating Nazi and Fascist radio propaganda activities for more than a year. It is made up of representatives of the State, Interior, Justice, Commerce and Agriculture Departments and the Export-Import Bank.

Persons close to the group said detailed information has been assembled and the committee is ready to report whenever the President desires.

Reliable sources said the investigation revealed that Germany and Italy are active in spreading their fascist propaganda by radio. German stations, they said, send programs of music, lectures and—often twice a day—news broadcasts flavored with the Nazi viewpoint. The broadcasts are sent by short wave, but arrangements have been made with South American stations to rebroadcast some of the programs on longer wave lengths readily picked up by standard radio sets. The programs are sent in both German and Spanish.
