

German Citizens Demand U. S. Oust Nazi Cbnsu

LOS ANGELES, March 21 (UP).
—One thousand Americanized Ger-
mans, who claimed their action
represented the sentiments of a
majority of naturalized Germans in
this country, demanded of Presi-
dent Roosevelt and Congress today
that the removal of Capt. Fritz
Wiedemann as Nazi consul general
of San Francisco.

At a mass meeting in Hollywood
last night they authorized a tele-
graphic protest to Mr. Roosevelt
and Congress in the name of the
German-American League for Cul-
ture, a nation-wide organization

claiming 85,000 members with
branches in 17 cities.

Identical telegrams dispatched to
the President and presiding officer
of the Senate and House, said in
part:

"We protest the un-American
activities of the Nazi-Bund and
ask you to take proper steps
against the agency of the Hitler
government. We strongly protest
the presence of Capt. Fritz Wiede-
mann, formerly private adjutant
of Mr. Hitler, in his new capacity
as German consul-general in San
Francisco.
