Thomas Hardir, vice chairman of the air safety board, in a letter to Hugo Lundquist, secretary of Aeronautical Mechanis Local 751, expressed appreciation for the union's interest and the information furnished to the Air Authority.

"It is a fact that members of the Bund are employed in the Boeing plant," Hardin said. He declared that possible sabotage was promptly investigated when this information was disclosed.

The FBI were also called into the probe, he said, to trace reports that the strategic productions link in national defense employed members of the Bund in important posts.

A resolution passed unanimously by the union in their first member-ship meeting following the crash urged the investigators turn the searchlight upon activities of Bund members in the plant.
