Don't Conscript Firemen, Asks **Chief Porter**

Fire Chief Stephen T. Porter, yes-terday advocated exemption of his men from conscription in case, of war as word reached local circles that methods of combating incen-diary bombings are being carefully studied by fire-protection experiation this country. this country. 2

"I am not an alarmist, and I far vently pray this country will how become involved in any war, but I can vividly recall the last war when some of our best men were called to the colors only to called to the colors only to create vacancies which had to be replaced vacancies which had to be replaced by inexperienced men," Porter said. The fire department of any com-munity is vital in the national de-fense program, Porter said, and pointed to lessons being taught now in Europe where fires have con-tinued to burn and spread because engines and trucks were caught in their houses when raiders bombed a city. Porter warned that any "fifth column" activities would be vigor-ously fought by his department. "Even in peacetime we have fire-bugs, but during a war crisis we must ever be on the alert for the fifth columnists," he said. It was learned the International Association of Fire Chiefs is making a careful study of effects of in-cendiary bombings and will make a report to the War Department in the near future. Porter said fire caused by the

report to the War Department in the near future. Porter said fire caused by the bombs are "next to impossible" to extinguish. "We can prevent the fire from spreading," he said, indi-cating the local fire department has been busy studying this situation.
