Union Probes Liquidonneter

Heilers Based on Union Pledge of Loyalty to U. S. A. 4/3/4レ

An investigation by District 4, United Electrical, Radio, and Machine Workers, CIO, into the presence of past and preesnt Nazi sympathizers in the factory of the Liquidometer Corp., maker of Army and Navy supplies, is under way today.

The inquiry was voted two weeks ago by the union's General Executive Board, and a committee to conduct it was elected. ndrew McLeish, president of the district, eads the committee which includes Peter abbondi, Charles Fay, Edward Stewart and layton Lang.

PM disclosed yesterday that men who ad openly sung the praises of Hitler—ome before Pearl Harbor and some since vere employed by Liquidometer, where hey had access to information of value to he enemy. The same situation exists in other war factories. The Liquidometer Corp. s situated at 36-16 Skillman Ave., Long sland City.

Government agencies, charged with the ob of preventing sabotage, yesterday de-lined to comment on PM's story. It was earned, however, that certain agencies egan investigating conditions in the facory when they heard that PM had been ooking into the situation.

The UERMW has a closed shop agreenent with the Liquidometer Corp.

The committee already has begun its in-restigation into the Liquidometer shop, but o charges have been preferred against

nyone so far.

Last night Clifford Haley, union shop hairman of the Liquidometer Corp., issued

he following statement:

As a matter of record, the union officers nd members of the Liquidometer shop ave had a consistent policy on the ques-ion of national defense and America's war ffort. At a membership meeting held in ne early part of June, 1941, a resolution as adopted condemning those elements in ur shop who owe allegiance to or are in meanthy with the ideologies of the govrnments of the totalitarian states.

'After the treacherous attack on Pearl larbor, the shop committee and the memership co-operated fully with the manage-ient of the Liquidometer Corp. to increase roduction in the shop. We even went to ne extent of modifying the rate of pay pecified in our union contract in order to

ork on Saturdays.

"Speaking for the shop committee, I can ly that we will co-operate fully with any overnment agency conducting an investigaon into the activities of anyone or any roup who may be engaged in any subversive ctivities or who are in any way hampering roduction in the shop.

"It is unfortunate that the people who ade these affidavits failed to follow acepted trade-union procedure and submit nese charges to the appropriate union comittees. By their actions, these people have iven the pro-Nazi element an opportunity o cover up their anti-American activities nd destroy important evidence which would be incriminating.

"As the spokesman for the workers of the

hop, I want to make it clear that while loing our solemn duty in co-operating with he government agency to expose all sub-ersive elements in the shop, we will not

tolerate any attempt by any individual or group who may have some ulterior motive in spreading disunity among the members of our union, and thereby disrupting the steady increase in production which is now

taking place.

The affidavits which revealed presence of Nazi sympathizers at the plant were given to officials of the union more than a week ago.

(Editors note: PM, too, believes that the majority of workers at Liquidometer and all the rest of our war plants are loyal Americans. It is only a minority of Hitler Heilers who are involved. The issue is simply the employment in vital war plants of men who have revealed their sympathies with Hitler.)
