The list of these 32 reads like a Who's Who" of fascism, defeatism nd treason, and includes Bundists
On the list is Laura Ingalls, convicted Nazi agent, and lecturer for the America First Committee; George Sylvester Viereck convict ed Nazi agent; Fritz Kuhn, former head of the Bund.
There, is William D. Pelley, edi tor of the suppressed Galllean: Rev. Charles E. Coughlin, editor closed down by the Government; Geo w. Chris tian; Rudolph Fahi: Gerald Smith; Lawrence Dennis; Rev: Gerald Winrod; William Kull gren; Geo. T. Eddelston; and Charles B. Hudson,
