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## O'RYAN ASKS WAR ENTRY

'Hitler Must Be Laughing at Our Confusion,' General Asserts

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 1—"Hitler must be laughing at our indecision, our confusion; it is just what he wants," declared General John F. O'Ryan of New York, as he arrived here today from Japan.

"What are we waiting for?" he asked. "We're the grand prize, the bull's eye of Hitler's target. Yet we just sit around voting money and playing 'The Star-Spangled Banner' and hoping this will keep Hitler away. Well, it won't, and every day we wait makes for tragic delay."

"If we do go in, Hitler can't get at us till he polishes off England, and he'll hit us then anyway," he went on.

America would not need to send an army abroad, but the United States should send aircraft, pilots, an efficient ground force to service the planes, and lesser warships to tighten Britain's blockade and help defeat Germany's attempted blockade of England, he asserted.

General O'Ryan returned on the liner Asama Maru after a trade and commerce study in Japan.
