

Nazi Propagandist Given Term for False Testimony

NEW YORK, Dec. 28—Louis Archer Zahne, 56, described by the United States attorney's office as "one of the Nazis' ablest paid speakers and propagandists," yesterday was sentenced to a year and a day in prison on his recent plea of guilty to making false statements before an Army exclusion board.

Zahne, American-born New York real estate operator, pleaded guilty to testifying falsely before the board that he was not a member of the Friends of New Germany, predecessor of the German-American Bund, and that he had not written a letter to A. Ammen von Borowsky, former officer in the United States Army Reserve, who had been excluded from the East Coast by Army authorities.

The Government charged that Zahne was group unit leader of the group and was one of its incorporators.
