Indicted on Sedition Count Indicted Service of the Wichita Indicted today by a Federal grand jury on a charge of sedition. The indictment accused them of acts "tending to discourage the recruiting for the enlisted service of the United States and to cause insubordination, disloyalty and mutiny in the armed forces of the United States."

S. S. Alexander, Federal district attorney for Kansas, said the indictment grew out of articles published in Publicity since the declaration of war by this country.

Elmer Garner, who was indicted today in Wichita, appeared before the Federal grand jury here last month while the grand jury was investigating Axis propaganda. He was in Washington several days, and testified on April 16 and 17.
