Elmer J. Garner, editor-publisher of Publicity, and his son James, an editorial assistant, were indicted by a Federal grand jury at Kansas City, Kans., last Saturday on charges of sedition in connection with material printed in the publication.

Walker ordered a hearing May 21 to give Publicity an opportunity to show cause why its second class mail privilege should not be revoked.

Action was taken by Walker upon receipt from Attorney General Francis Biddle of information concerning the allegedly seditious activities of the publication.
