New York Daily Still Pro-Nazi

Six months after Pearl Harbor, the New York Russian-language daily Rossiya, edited by Nikolai Ryba-

Rybakoff, PM has learned, regarded himself as a "co-trooper" of Anastase Vonsiat-sky, leader of the Fascist Russian party in this country and now under indictment as a Nazi-Japanese spy.

In a letter to Vonsiatsky, some time before Pearl Harbor, Rybakoff wrote:

Deeply esteemed and dear co-trooper... Your decision to dedicate your energy and strength to the cause of Fascism deserves the deepest appreciation and full collaboration on our part.... Your sheet the Fascist makes a wonderful impression."

Last week, Rossiya, two months after PM had first revealed its pro-Nazi line and its characterization by a Tokyo magazine as an organ of the Fascist Russian party here, made these contributions to the Axis war

". . . the happy outcome of the present struggle will be the soon and inevitable liberation of our country (Russia) from the foreign anti-Russian Communist Satanforeign anti-Russian

To Rossiya, a Hitler victory over our military ally is a "happy outcome."

It attacked, by implication, the present extensive War Bond campaign and all

monies raised for our war effort, writing:

"It is useless to think that the assignment of billions of dollars on the part of the great powers for the overcoming of the pseudo-causes of this world catastrophe will solve the problem."

Rossiya preaches that the war was started

by Russia and that Hitler was in no way to

blame.

". . . the bloody world crisis . . . was brought about by satanic Communism and everything else is wrongly viewed as its cause. . . The only and real cause of this bloody slaughter is the. . . . Communist Internationals." ternationale

This is Hitler's basic propaganda theme that he was forced into world aggression by Russia.

On Apr. 21, PM revealed that workers in New Jersey war plants had been receiving Russian-language handbills urging them to stop fighting Hitler.

A type expert identified the handbills as

having been printed by linotype machines in the Rossiya plant.

About 12,000 copies of Rossiya are pub-

lished every day.
