

Suicide of Second Bund Probe Witness Revealed

NEW YORK, June 23.—The second suicide of a prospective witness before a Federal grand jury investigating German-American Bund activities was revealed yesterday by United States Attorney Mathias Correa.

Mr. Correa said that George Schwindl, German-born naturalized American citizen who was found dead of gas poisoning in his East Side apartment Sunday, had been served with a grand jury subpoena returnable yesterday.

Schwindl, 42, had been a bund member since 1939, Mr. Correa said.

First prospective witness to kill himself was George Froebese of Milwaukee, Midwest Bund leader, who jumped under a railroad train in Waterloo, Ind., last week while en route to New York to testify.

Schwindl's wife Hilda told police her husband had been brooding over the loss of his job at the Brewster Aeronautical Corp. of Long Island City. He came to the United States in 1928, became a citizen in 1936 and worked for the aircraft plant for about two years.
