

SILVER SHIRT FASCISTS PRINT 5,000 COPIES OF DIES' AIDE SPEECH ON PERKINS

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 14.
—The Silver Shirts, notorious anti-Semitic outfit with close Nazi tie-ups, have printed for public distribution 5,000 copies of a speech by a member of the Dies Committee, Rep. J. Parnell Thomas, R., of New Jersey.

In announcing a special edition of the Thomas speech, Liberation, official Silver Shirt organ, described it as a "scathing indictment of Jewish New-Dealism from beginning to end."

This makes the second time in the past few weeks that the Silver Shirts have gone to bat for the Dies Committee. Only recently Liberation urged continuation of the Dies probe and boasted that the Silver Shirts would be immune from investigation.

A demand for the impeachment of Secretary of Labor Frances Perkins is made in the Thomas speech which the Silver Shirts have published in pocket-size as a special pamphlet. The

speech was first delivered on the House floor.

DEMANDS OF IMPEACHMENT

Liberation declares that the Thomas speech "will serve as format for the document that is on its way impeaching Roosevelt himself."

Practically the entire issue of the Silver Shirt sheet is taken up with lengthy articles demanding that President Roosevelt be impeached. One of them is headed

"engineering the great Roosevelt removal."

Announcement of the publication of Thomas's speech as a pamphlet is made in a large advertisement in Liberation. The ad contains a caricature of Miss Perkins distorting her features.

The text of the ad boosting the speech by the Dies Committee member says:

"Few of the nation's papers on Jan. 24, gave the public the full text of the long speech which Rep. Thomas delivered on the

floor of the House impeaching the New Deal Labor Secretary. It was a scathing indictment of Jewish New-Dealism from beginning to end."

"Thousands will want copies of the unexpurgated text. It will serve as format for the document that is on its way impeaching Roosevelt himself. This great document should have as wide a reading as the anti-New Dealers can give it. This is the first real crack in the Roosevelt front. Publicize it."
