

Garner Dubbed President In Silver Shirt Sheet

America's fascists have appointed John Nance Garner President of the United States.

Each week "Liberation," obscene Nazi-inspired magazine published by William Dudley Pelley and his Silver Shirts, prints an idealized portrait of the tory vice-president with a caption, "President John Nance Garner," studiously dropping the "vice."

Each week there appears in the same rag a caricature captioned "Franklin D. Roosevelt," with the title of the elected President of the nation as studiously dropped.

The cuts illustrate a series of Goebbels' style articles on impeachment of the President, echoing every

slander in the dictator-controlled press of Germany and Italy.

The illegal, seditious intent of the articles is clear, though in print the Silver Shirts have not yet dared be quite so open with their program as the cry shouted by their roving "Field Marshall," Roy Zachary, at a Chicago meeting last May: "If no one else will volunteer to shoot him (President Roosevelt), I will."

Garner was Hearst's choice for President in 1932. When Cactus Jack failed to win the nomination, it was the yellow press lord who engineered him into the vice-presidential spot.

Ford, in an exclusive Hearst press interview, has endorsed Garner for President in 1940.
