

PELLEY DARES MARTIN DIES

William Dudley Pelley, head of the Silver-shirts, threatens mass action by his followers if the Dies Committee should summon him for questioning.

In his publication, "Liberation," he says:

"If Pelley is summoned . . . large representations of Silver-shirts will be on hand during the Dies attack on Pelley . . . the testimony will be broadcast . . . and representatives of House and Senate groups who are secretly in sympathy with Pelley, will be on hand to use the episode as foundation for a subsequent demand for an investigation."

J. H. Peyton, Los Angeles regent of the "American Rangers," has taken another tack.

He sought out Dies Committee investigators, addressed them before a stenographer, then rushed into print with a special pamphlet which says:

"We are well aware of what happened to Gen. George Van Horn Moseley when he testified in Washington before the Committee and we are not anxious to have the situation repeated."

Peyton goes on to charge that "certain vital documents have been withheld . . . by the Dies Committee from the knowledge of the American public."
