Funds for Spy Drive May Be Sought

Problem Declared
Worst Since War

WASHINGTON, April 7.—Government officials indicated today that the administration may seek additional funds from Congress to expand its anti-spy campaign.

Officials of the defense departments said the spy problem was more serious than at any time since the World War.

Attorney General Frank Murphy said that he had been conferring regularly with J. Edgar Hoover, Chief of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Army and Navy Intelligence units, as well as the Treasury's secret service, are working closely with the Justice Department.
