Leonard Musa, 55, was held under
\$5000 bail today on charges that he
acted as a secret agent for the Vichy
French government without registering with the State Department,
He will be given a hearing July 21.

U. S. Attorney Mathias Correa said Musa was employed by French Ambassador Gaston Henri Haye from September, 1940, and was paid until April, 1942, out of funds of the French government on deposit here in the "services of information account."

Correa said Musa, a Swiss-born naturalized American, was employed by the Ambasador personally and that the suspect had in his possession a letter from a high officer in the French Embassy in Washington stating that "the allowance of the Ambassador has been increased to remunerate such persons as yourself who are obtaining information here."
